

North Killingholme Parish Council

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held in the Village Hall at 7.00 pm on Monday 11th March 2019 at 7.00pm.

PUBLIC FORUM

The road sweeper has visited East Halton Road, North Killingholme but has not been able to do a good job – residents were promised that N.L.C workmen would return with shovels to clear the sludge away but this has not happened as yet. Resident agreed to forward photographs to clerk who will send on to N.L.C representatives and ask for the road/curb side to be properly cleaned.

It was reported that HGV's and petrol tankers are still travelling along East Halton Road to access the LOR power station and that the large HGV's transporting the portacabins in preparation for the shutdown to LOR are also travelling along East Halton Road.

It was reported that the land opposite the properties on East Halton Road has had a change of usage registered to employment land in 2016. This was apparently adopted at a full council meeting but there is no recollection of the parish council being consulted. Cllr Hannigan agreed to investigate this matter.

A resident reported that traffic has increased through the village as East Field Road has been shut - Rebecca Brimble from LOR advised the meeting that LOR is doing all it can to ensure all employees and contractors are asked and encouraged not to use a route through the village. LOR cannot insist that they do not travel through the village but can insist that vehicles do not speed.

Registration numbers of vehicles which appear to be speeding should be reported to LOR.

Rebecca Brimble reassured the meeting that as the shut down approaches traffic will be monitored more closely. It was noted that whatever measures are taken to discourage traffic travelling through the village will impact on East Halton Road.

The company taking water from the hydrants on East Halton Road do, apparently, have the necessary permits to take the water. The company in question has been told that the drivers are leaving a mess when they collect the water and have been asked to ensure that this does not continue. A resident advised the meeting that the drivers have now moved to use a hydrant on Lancaster Approach and the resident advised the meeting that she had been in touch with Anglian water who have suggested that no permit has been provided and that Anglian Water will take this matter up with the company in question.

Members of the public asked parish councillors to support them and object to the planning application PA/2019/167 on Lancaster Approach.

IT WAS RESOLVED to adopt the minutes of the parish council meeting held on 11th February 2019 and authorise the Chairman to sign the minutes.

19/134 Clerks/Chairman's report : No further matters not listed in public forum to report.

19/135 Report from Total LOR – The LOR turnaround is scheduled for the end of May to the end of July. The manager in charge of this process will attend a parish council meeting – hopefully April – to talk through arrangements. The next community alarm test is scheduled for 16/3/19 at 2pm and the proposal is not to send out letters to residents listing the alarm dates but to have them on the calendar – which is a tear off sheet which can be pinned to a notice board and also on the parish council website. It was also suggested that the alarm dates – as on the calendar along with the company contact information could be posted on the village notice board.

19/136 Planning

Opportunity for one person from each side to state, within 3 minutes , objections/support of contested applications.

- a) Application PA/2019/167 – Planning permission for a temporary construction site compound inclusive of porta cabin offices, car parking, toilets, welfare facilities and cable drum storage areas – Land south of Unit B access roads in disused airfield, North Killingholme.

IT WAS RESOLVED unanimously to object to this planning application suggesting that the traffic generated from this proposed development will lead to highway safety concerns – the local roads are not suitable for such large vehicles which will not be able to negotiate the roads safely along with environmental and noise pollution.

It was reported that the PCC were probably in a position to take on the grass cutting of the churchyard and that the North Killingholme Fittie land Charity would contribute later in the year when they were more aware of their financial situation. It was noted that the parish council would be receptive to making a contribution to the cutting of the grass at the church yard if required. This will be an agenda item for discussion next month.

19/138 NATS Meeting

- i) NATS Meeting – The next NATS meeting is scheduled for 4/4/19 in South Killingholme Village Hall. Cllr Shelley will attend and will ask for an update on traffic and the speed watch programme.

19/139 North Lincolnshire Council Matters

- i) Reports from N.L.C representatives: The N.L.C budget has been set with a 2.9% increase in the general council tax. Cllr Hannigan reported on a meeting held regarding the waste on the airfield with Martin Vickers MP, Cllr Richard Hannigan and Theresa Coffey MP. It is felt that progress is being made in ensuring the removal of the waste on the airfield and the Government is providing substantial funding to ensure this matter can be resolved. The Government has also said that all those that have profited from the waste must be prosecuted.

Cllr Hannigan also spoke about the problem of the fly infestation last summer and has asked to be provided with names and addresses of all local farmers so that N.L.C can write to them ahead of this summer to ask them to ensure that they spread/move their manure responsibly.

Cllr Broddley asked Cllr Wells to look into a company on the airfield – who appear to be undertaking building work with no permissions applied for.

- ii) Traffic/Highways : Cllr Broddley advised the meeting that the road will be closed in close proximity to the next bridge closure – it was noted that a road closure can only be within a certain distance of the works being undertaken. The plan is to allow HGV traffic leaving Lancaster Approach to turn left only – cars may be able to turn right but it will be a very awkward manoeuvre for them. The plan is to discourage all vehicles from turning right. The residents of East Halton Road asked if some form of barrier can be erected to prevent HGV's mounting the curbs and grass verges close to the residents properties – physical barriers are required – not just signs. Cllr Broddley agreed to put forward this request.
